CLINIC DESCRIPTIONS

99-cent Modeling- *Gene Bohot* Modeling supplies and tools available for 99-cents (more or less). High-quality tools are sometimes necessary to get the best results. But I have always been "careful with my spending" (some would say 'cheap') and quite often you can achieve good results without spending a lot of money. Some free samples may be available.

DCC Friendly Turnouts – *Tom Boyles* So called "DCC Friendly" turnouts have insulated frogs that are therefore dead electrically. Several methods of powering these frogs will be presented.

Vagaries of DCC and Consisting-The good, the bad and the ugly – *Jim Fuhrman* Jim Fuhrman will discuss and demonstrate DCC consisting. The railroads he models rarely operated a single unit to lead a train, and modeling locomotive consists accurately, with lights on where they belong on and off where they don't, was a primary goal of his switching from DC to DCC

Hidden Treasure- Economical Building Kits – *Carl Heimberger* This clinic will show how to take an inexpensive plastic building kit and turn it into craftsman type model. Carl will also talk about common errors modelers do that can cost you points if you are having your work judged. .

Judging for AP Evaluation – *Bill Jacobs* Learn how to judge (or evaluate) a model for the AP. Participants are welcome to observe the judging of the models after the clinic.

Operations with computers using RailOp – *Jim Kruchten* Jim will give an intro into RailOp and how to use it. He will also answer questions and talk about the fun of operations.

The Water Train and the Arrowhead Line – *Mark Landis* Mark will present a photo history of the Pacific Electric Railway's famous "Arrowhead Line" that carried passengers and tank cars of the spring water through the streets of downtown San Bernardino.

You want to do WHAT? In the Backyard ?? – *Morrie Fleischman* After spending 28 years building a garage HO layout it was time to add a garden railroad in the backyard. This clinic describes the initial effort required in building that F-scale garden railroad.

Tree Building for Anyone- *Todd Scott* This clinic will show you how to build trees quickly, easily, and most of all, cheaply. Todd will tell you where he buys the material and give you the cost for everything. You will be shown how to build trees for any scale layout, how to color them, and for those that wish to build a tree he will help you all the way through and you will be able to take it home with you. There is no cost for this clinic and Todd guarantees you can build a tree with the information you will be given and shown.
