

Maybe, as a result of all of this, we'll be able to solidify the Cajon Division even better, come up with some new ideas and be able to get back to our most important business - that of having fun together with a great hobby.

A group of Cajon Division members are promoting to the Board of Directors of the Pacific Coast Region a petition that the Board of Directors intervene in the current election of Division officers. We take this step reluctantly, because we heartily wish to get the whole hing over with and get back to model railroading. Nevertheless, we believe that there have been so many errors in handling the affair that the new ballot which members have recently received is open to exactly the same charges as were used against the original election — that is, the election could easily be rigged. We further believe that the manner in which the matter has been handled has had the effect, with or without the intent, of condemning our former Superintendent and our former Ballot Chairman without a hearing. We further believe that the entire dispute is the result of a callous and calculated attempt on the part of a small group of members to obtain control of the Division for commercial purposes (i.e., the 1981 NMRA Convention), thereby subverting the basic intent of the Association.

We are asking the Board of Directors of Pacific Coast Region to do two things:

(1) Investigate the circumstances of the original election, to determine if in fact there is reason to believe that it was conducted in an improper manner, or if there is any other reason to hold a new election (for example, to "clear the air");

(2) If they find that a new election should be held, we are asking the Board to conduct the election, using some method (such as the two-envelope system prescribed by Roberts Rules of Order) which will ensure that nobody can tamper with the procedures or results.

We ask that this be published in the Order Board so that all members of the Division will know what is happening and why. Members desiring to have more detailed information on our action and the reasons for it are invited to contact any of the following members:






