
Hunter Park is located a few miles North of downtown Riverside on Columbia Avenue, ½ mile east of the Riverside Freeway (Columbia Offramp).

Cajon Commentary

In some ways the Division is doing very well. Attendance at the last three functions totaled over 870 persons, the treasury is in sound condition, and the hobby shops continue to provide great support in the publicity and door prize areas.

In other areas, however, we are probably no further along than when I became Superintendent a year and a half ago. The last two elections averaged 51 votes out of 260 possible; requests for member advise and suggestions to the Director and myself have largely been ignored; lack of response has prevented a layout tour day and killed plans for such tours at the Fall Meet; few articles are submitted to the ORDER BOARD, few volunteer for clinics (2 of the 3 presentors at the Summer Meet were from the L.A. Division), and at the last scheduled business meeting only two members (from the same family, at that) bothered to show up.

I'm not down on our Division. I'm satisfied that we (a few of us) are getting things done. But... if we could get a little more member participation we could have six to eight good activities a year and with a lot more variety than

we currently enjoy.

We've a few more months left in this year. This should be time enough for you to decide what one thing are you going to do for YOUR Division in 1980. How about it?

Business Meeting Held

A general business meeting was held July 12 at the home of Superintendent Bob Chaparro in Corona. The meeting was attended only by two other members although ample advance notice was given in the ORDER BOARD.

At the meeting the By-Laws ballots were counted (see related story), the 1980 banquet discussed, and the problem of low contest turn-outs discussed. The Division's financial status was determined to be quite good. The cash balance as of the meeting date was \$1258.91 although this did not include deductions for recent printing charges for the ORDER BOARD and meet expenses. These charges were estimated to be \$700.

Another business meeting will be scheduled prior to the February Banquet primarily for the orientation of potential candidates for the Divisional Directorship to the PCR. Check the next ORDER BOARD for details.


