Cajon Div Auction Dec 1

The Model Railroad Auction is the Cajon Division's next big event. This will be held on Saturday, Dec. 1, 1979 from 10 am to 3 pm in the Community Room of Glendale Federal Savings, 320 North Harbor Blvd., Fullerton. The room will be open at 8 am for sellers.

Admission to the Auction is \$1.00. Items actually sold will be assessed a ten percent (10%) fee based on the ultimate selling price. No fee will be charged to items not sold.

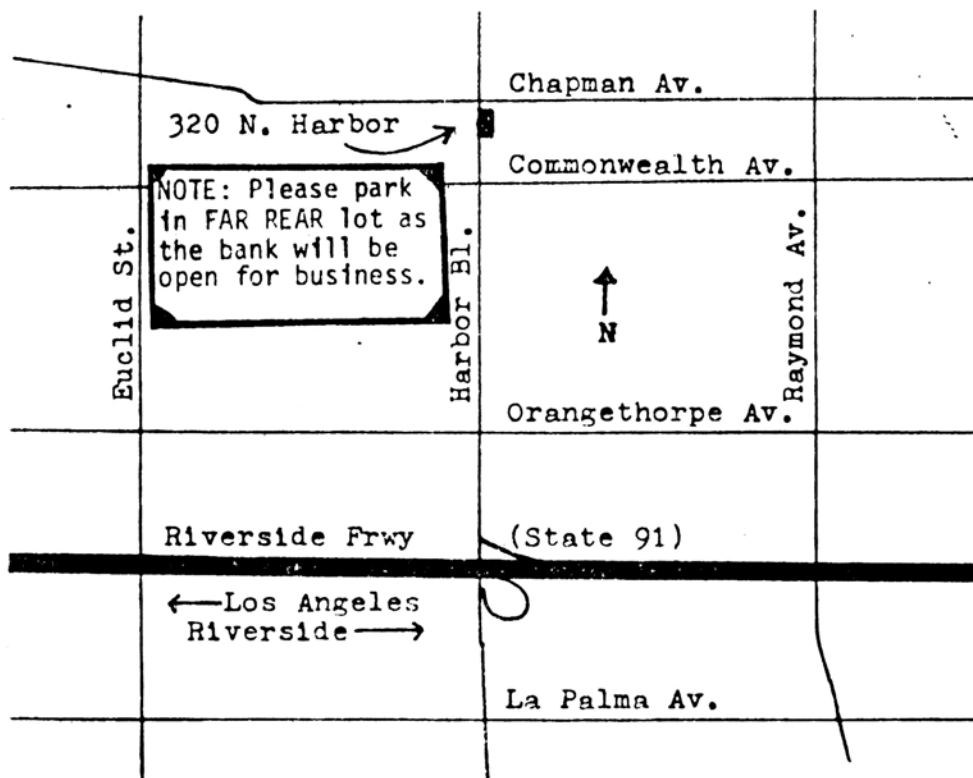
Once again the Cajon Division will pull out all the stops to sell your model railroad treasures, including books and magazines. There's a five dollar minimum per item or lot, so bring lots of cash and energy. Nearly four thousand dollars of items were auctioned last year, let's go for more this year.

This is your chance to buy and sell railroad hobby items in an atmosphere quite different than the usual swap meet with the established minimum bid price the seller sets a floor for his profit and the buyer knows the least possible price he can offer for the available item.

If you have items to sell, plan on bringing an open top box or cardboard mounting sheet for each item (except books & magazines) plus a felt-tip marker for identifying the items on the auction cards.

If you plan to buy, bring plenty of cool green cash because there's going to be a lot to spend it on.

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Chairpersons Needed

RAILETES - Duties include coordinating meet activities for spouses and children, assisting with railette activities at the 1980 PCR Convention in Anaheim next May (optional duty), and generally providing the "family balance" at meets that has been lacking in recent years.

MEMBER AID - Functions to put modelers with questions and needs in contact with others having answers and skills. NOMINATING - Duties include collecting nominations for the three divisional offices (Superintendent, Chief Clerk & Paymaster and Division Director) and supervising elections for the three divisional offices.

Photo Contest

As an experimental item the Division is sponsoring a railroad subject photo contest with a \$25.00 cash prize to the entry judged best among the winners of the four entry categories. These categories are 1. Black & white-model, 2. Color, model, 3. Black & white-prototype, 4. Color-prototype. Entries are limited to 5 x 7 prints. Modified PCR photo contest rules will be used to govern and judge this contest.

U P Yard Tour March 15

The tour price will probably be in the five dollar range and will include bus transportation from Orange and Riverside Counties. This tour will be limited to between 120 to 140 persons.

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PCR CAJON DIVISION AUCTION AGREEMENT

1. This auction committee reserves the right to handle the auction and all matter concerning the auction as it sees fit. It further reserves the right to reject any item without stated cause.
 2. Any matter regarding the auction should be brought to the auction chairman's attention; however, all matters shall be up to his judgement.
 3. Once your items are entered into the auction, the item, or items cannot be removed until the item is either sold or rejected as a "no-bid" item.
 4. All sales must be handled through the auction committee and the cashier.
 5. Items will be auctioned off by number sequence, unless the auction committee representative elects to do otherwise.
 6. It is agreed that the seller shall pay 10% of the selling price to the auction committee; this 10% fee shall be deducted from the selling price of the item.
 7. Buyer shall pay for his purchase before the seller receives his money.**
 8. Bid shall advance by amounts to be determined by the Auctioneer.
 9. Each item shall be called three times before being sold. Items will not be described in detail.
 10. At completion of sale, item will be forwarded to cashier who will collect the amount agreed upon before delivering purchase to buyer.
 11. All items must be mounted on a temporary cardboard sheet for handling, or enclosed in an open top box. All items must be of a minimum five dollar value each or a lot value minimum of five dollars.
 12. All items or monies due the seller must be claimed no later than the close of the auction.
 13. Neither the auction committee nor the Cajon Division-PCR, assumes responsibility for condition or truthfulness of fact of any item.
- **Only checks made out to "Cajon Division-PCR" will be accepted. All checks must be approved by the Auction Committee and must be substantiated by driver's license identification. If the buyer pays by check the seller will be reimbursed by a Cajon Division check.

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
