OPEN HOUSE -- CAJON & SANTA FE RAILROAD. Sunday, October 25

The HO scale Cajon & Santa Fe Railway Company will host an Open House on Sunday, October 25 from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. A continuous slide show featuring prototype and model railroad subjects also will be presented. These events are free to the model railroading public.

The HO scale C&SF represents a mythical bridge line connecting the Burlington Northern and the Union Pacific on its North with the Santa Fe and Southern Pacific to the South.

The C&SF's real location is 2428 Monterey Peninsula Drive, Corona, not far from Santa Fe's Prado siding (Mile Post 29, Third District, Los Angeles Division for the purists!). The 182 sq. ft. layout occupies the perimeter of a 24' x 24' family room. Construction is a combination of wall-attached and cabinet mounted benchwork plus two lift-out bridges. a 5' x 4' detachable table is under consideration as a future benchwork addition.

The C&SF is affiliated with the Rusty Rails and the largely unknown Society of Occasional Engineers. The owner is a life member of the NMRA and the Cajon Division.

How To Get There: From Orange County-- 91 Freeway to Serfas Club Drive, turn Right on Monterey Peninsula Drive. 2428 will come up on your Left. Look for the red roof. From Pomona area--71 Freeway South to 91 Freeway East and follow Orange County Directions. From Ontario area--Euclid Ave. South to 71 Freeway South, then follow Pomona directions.
