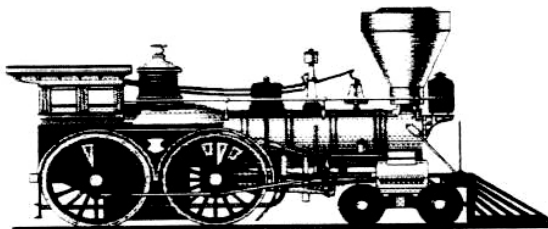
We will have clinics, favorite model contest, etc. And the addmission is **FREE!**

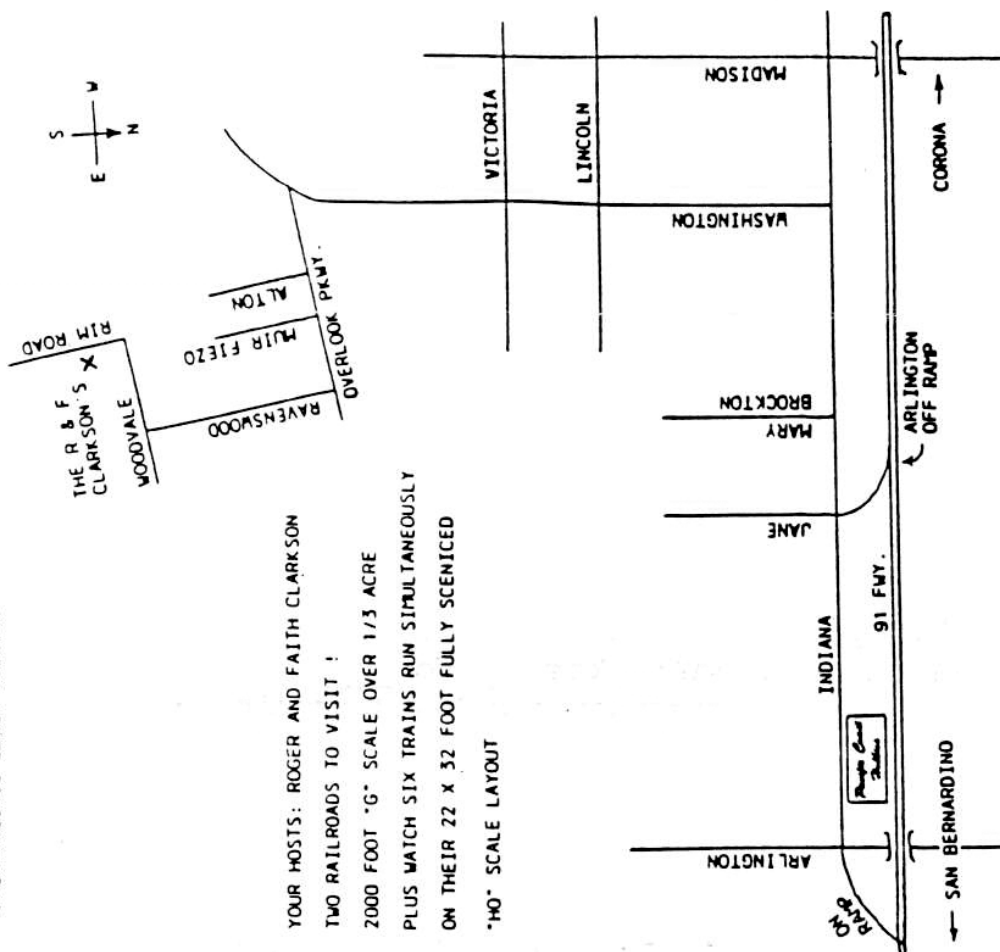
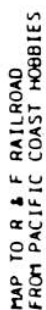
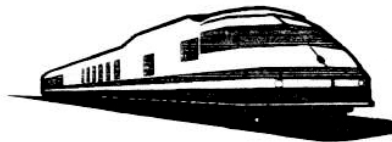
