#### News from California






HEY! Superintendent

#### **AP Report**

There has been a lot of questions regarding the Achievement Program. How doe it work, what do I need to do, am I eligible to be in it, etc.. Well this new column will address all areas o he Achievement Program (AP). Between Ed Hall, who is a Master Model Railroader, and myself, we will cover all areas of the AP until we have a full time AP Chairperson to take over.

The AP exists to recognize your achievement in the hobby of Model Railroading. This recognition takes the form of "Certificates o Achievement" that you can earn. You will be able to earn certificates in these catagories; Master Builder Cars, Motive Power, Structures, Scenery Prototype Models, Model RR Engineer (civil and electrical), Chief Dispatcher, Association Official, Volunteer, Model RR Author, Plus Service to the NMRA. You only need 7 of the 11 certificates to become a "Master Model Railroader".

We will discuss each of these at the meets as well as in the Order Board, plus any extras that would be benificial to you. Check out the NMRA web site for the complete AP file, or ask a Division Officer for more info. One of the best ways to get started in the AP is to go for the "Golden Spike Award" first. This is what you will need to do:

- 1. Rolling Stock [Motive Power and Cars]: Display 6 units of Rolling Stock (scratchbuilt, craftsman, or detailed commercial kit).
- 2. Model Railroad Setting (Scener and Structures):
- a. Construct 8 square feet of layout including scenery.
- b. Construct 5 structures (scratchbuilt, craftsman, or detailed commerical kits). If a module has less than 5 structures, additional structures separate from the scene may be presented.
- 3. Engineering (Civil and Electrical): a. 3 types of trackage required (turnout, crossing, etc.) All must be properly ballasted and installed on proper roadbed. Commercial trackage may be used.
- b. All installed trackage must be

properly wired so that 2 trains can be operated simultaneously. (Double track main, single track main with sidings and block or command control). c. Provide 1 additional Electrical feature such as powered turnouts, signaling, turnout indication, lighted buildings, etc.

If you have met ALL of the

If you have met ALL of the requirements and would like to have your layout judged, then contact a Division Officer to set up a time to come and have a look.

#### Report from Chattanooga: "Modeling with the Masters

"Modeling with the Masters" is an ongoing NMRA workshop series with hands-on instruction provided by a group of Master Model Railroaders. The programs are intended for beginning to intermediate modelers, and all NMRA members are encouraged to attend as participant students. This series of workshops is the brainchild o MMR Clark Kooning, who has headed up the first two workshops in the series, the first in March and the second in October 1999. Other instructors at these workshops have been MMR's Allen McClelland, Peter B. Smith and Peter Moffett

The themes of the first two workshops have been General Modeling Techniques, and Structures, respectively. A third workshop is planned for March 2000, although a theme has not yet been developed.

Each workshop has been designed to occupy two full days of modeling and three evenings of preparatory instruction and clinics. The NMRA headquarters building in Chattanooga serves as the site for all hands-on work. Each participant must provide his own transportation to/for Chattanooga and pay a \$395.00 registration fee. The fee covers hotel accommodations for 3 nights, 2 lunches, and all materials/kits and instruction. Participants must provide

their own modeling tools.

I have attended both of the first two workshops in Chattanooga, and highly recommend them to others. The MMR instructors possess a wealth of knowledge concerning most phases of model railroading, and do an excellent job o passing it on to their students. I feel that I most benefitted from learning a number of simple skills and techniques that apply to many modeling projects and which I probably never would have picked up on my own. Also, by being introduced to a variety of new (to me) modeling projects and tools that make modeling more fun.

If you think you might be interested in attending the next in the series of "Modeling with the Masters", keep your eye on the monthly *NMRA Bulletin* for an announcement and particulars on reserving a slot for yourself. We all had a GREAT time and make some new friends, members from Nevada, Barstow, even some Friends fro the LA Division came to the meet. That's what it's all about.
