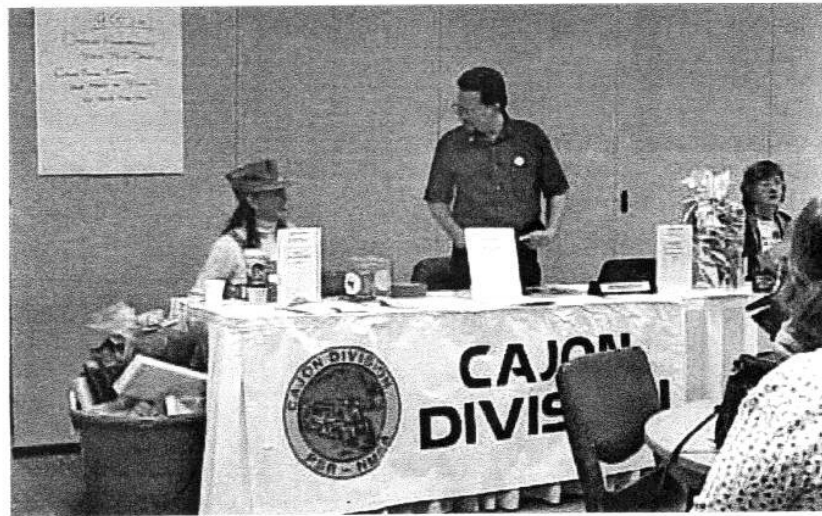

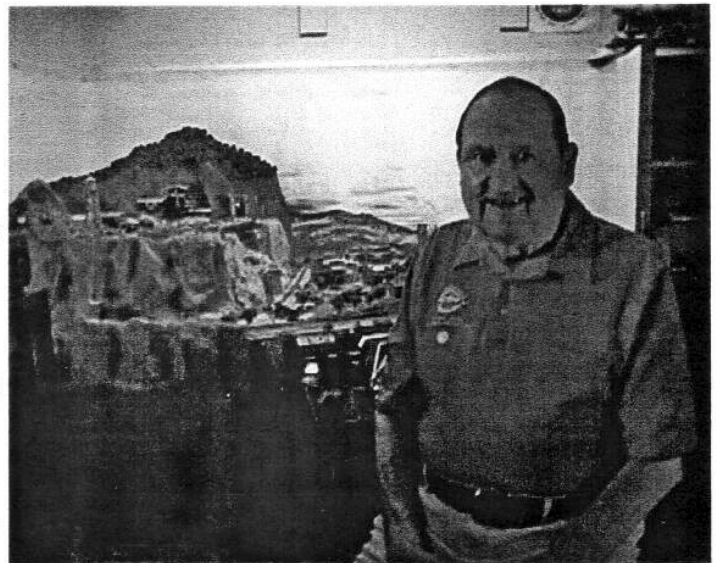
## Historian

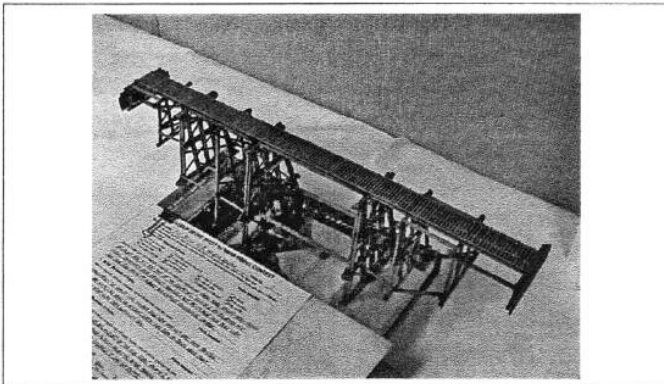

Kurt Meisel brought his HO Timesaver for the contest. First place went to youth member Daniel Kociemski and second went to fellow modeler Dennis Miller.

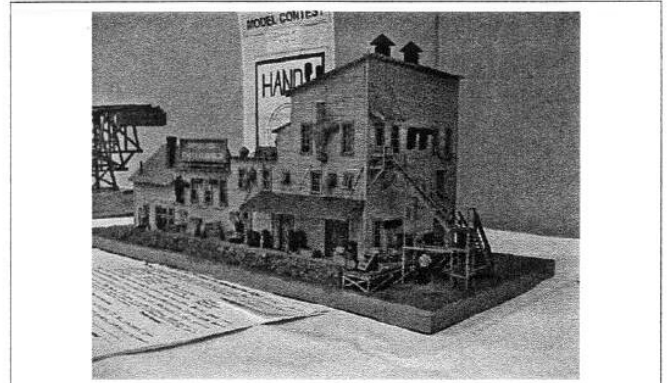
There were two entries in the model contest portion of the

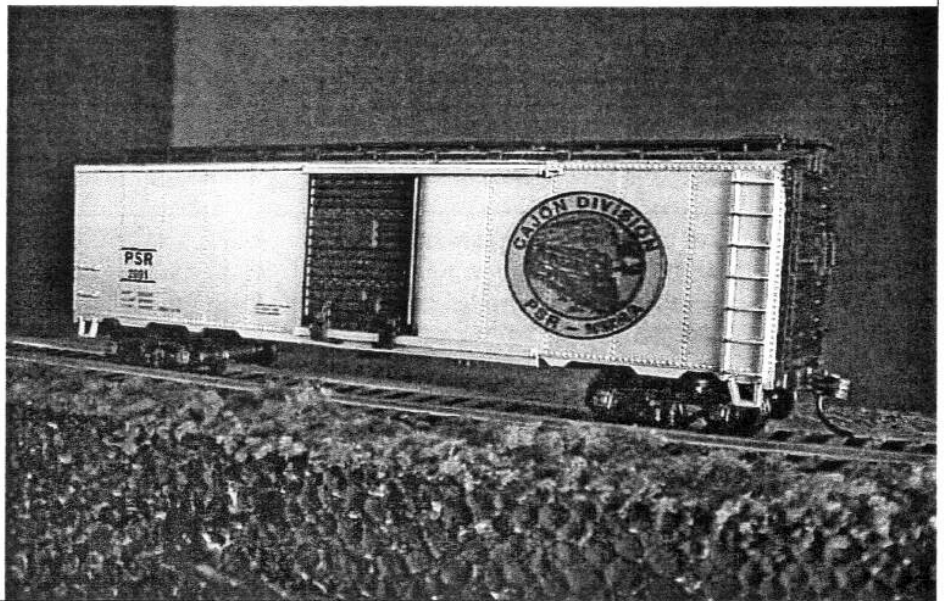

## CALIFORNIA REPORT

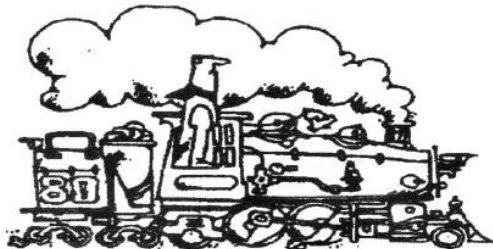

## CONTEST CORNER

### Remember for the Barstow Meet — Cajon Division First Annual Diorama Contest Rules:

1. All dioramas must be 1' x 2' with no part of the display extending outside these measurements. They may be as tall (vertical elevation above or below level) as the modeler wishes to make them. If a backdrop is used it must fit within these measurements.
2. Each diorama must be completely self contained. Dioramas may be built to be displayed together however no pieces may be used on more than one diorama. For example: Two dioramas are built, each representing two halves of a gorge with the intent being to feature a large trestle spanning the gorge. You are not allowed to set up the two dioramas next to one another and then set the trestle in between them. If you wanted to model this scene then half of the trestle would need to be modeled on EACH diorama so that when they are next to one another it appears to be one large trestle yet the dioramas are actually self contained.
3. The diorama can be done in any scale and it must contain at least four different items from the list of features provided below (meaning your diorama could contain A, C, F, and K and be OK. However, 4 trees (B) only count as one item from the list):

#### Features:

A. Track	E. Rolling Stock	I. Trestle	M. Rocks
B. Trees	F. Water	J. Snow	N. Sound
C. Building/structure	G. Figure – Person	K. Figure – Animal	O. Animation
D. Lights	H. Vehicle	L. Vehicle	

4. Somewhere on the diorama at least one reference must be made to railroading. This could be abandoned track, a wrecked train car, a railroad sign or structure. Even something like a tavern called “The Whistle Stop” would work because it is a reference to railroading. Use your imagination.
5. During the Annual Membership Meeting, all participants agree to bring their dioramas to be displayed.
6. There will be a basic popular vote to choose the Best of Show, Funniest, and the Most Creative Use of Space under each category.

Well, there you have it. To me, it sounds like fun and I'll be starting mine in the near future. There will be prizes that will be determined as we near meeting time. I don't know what they will be yet, but I have lots of time to figure them out. These displays will not be for the AP program. If you have structures or rolling stock included that you wish to be judged for the AP program, that's O.K. This can be arranged at the meeting (don't forget the paperwork).

If it sounds like a fun thing for you, let me know and I'll keep a list of all who wish to enter and follow the above rules.

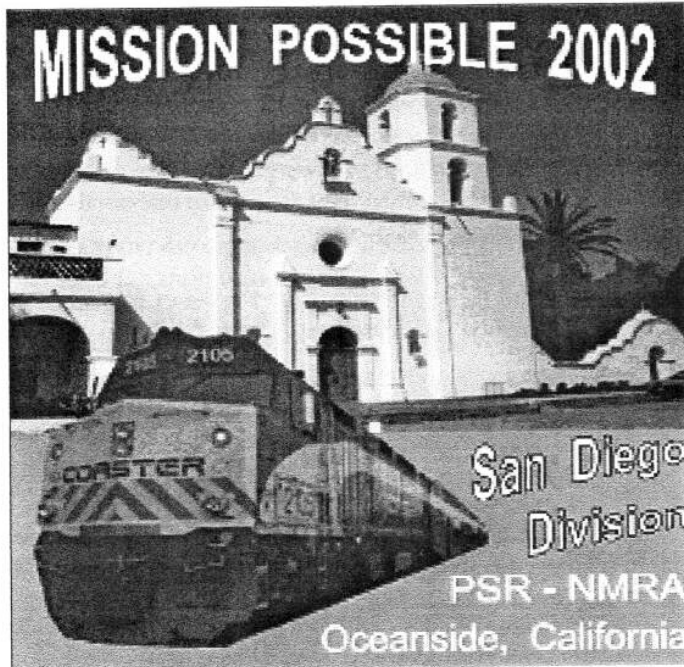
### “FLASH”

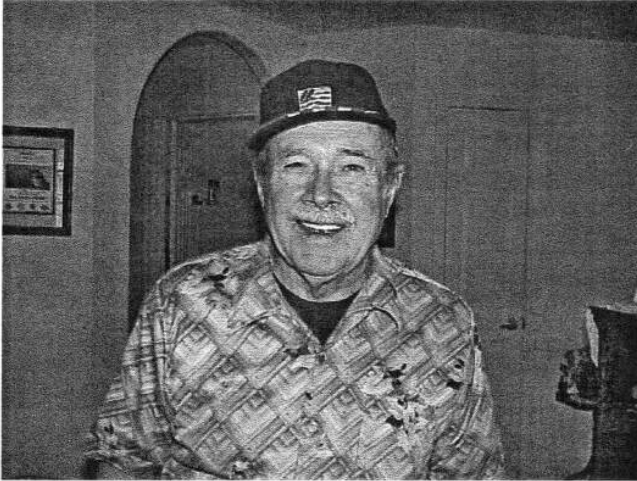

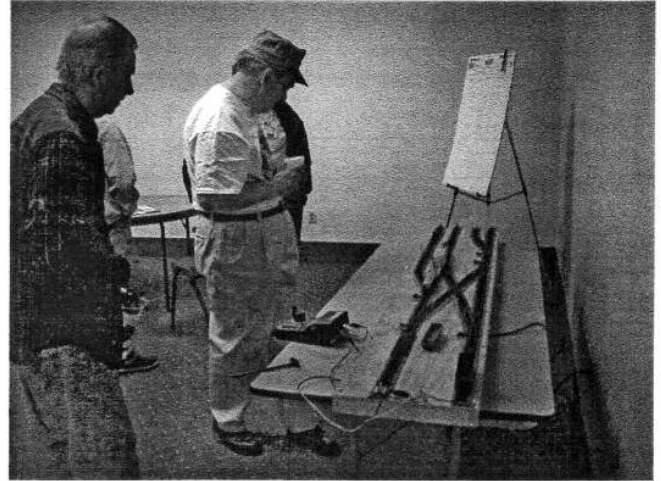

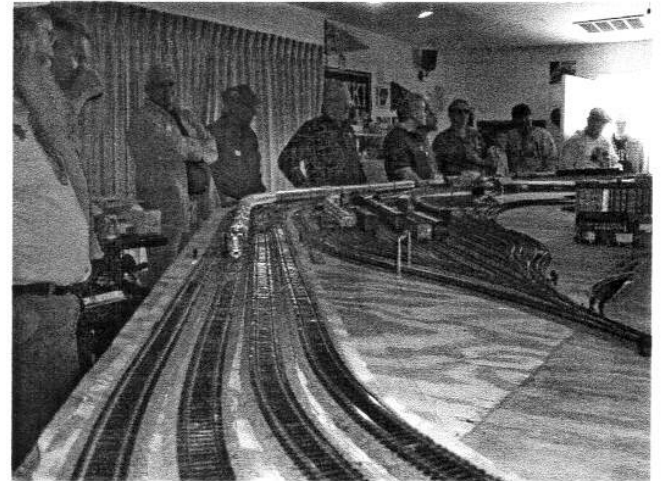
