Cajon Commentary By Bob Chaparro, Superintendent

There are four major items addressed in this issue of the ORDER BOARD: The banquet/business meeting, the module/swap meet, the Barstow Tour and the Division Election. Of these four I believe the election to be the

most important.

It is important to me because the participation in this election by the membership as candidates and as voters either gives this Division a broad base of interest and support or it renders the Division nothing more than an on-paper local component of the NMRA and PCR. We either have democratic, high-consensus organization of model railroaders or we have a dis-united collection of names on a membership role led by a very small group of persons lacking direction and purpose.

As I write this column I have no idea how many candidates will be running for the two offices. This is intentional as I do not want to become involved in the election process itself for obvious reasons. I hope you will give careful consideration to every candidate's statement and that you will cast a thoughtful vote. As the office I hold has no ego value for me I would rather lose with eighty percent of you voting than win with

a ten percent turn-out.

The Division's proposed By-Laws are not progressing as well as expected. Considerable effort has been expended by Chairman Art Burges and others in drafting, editing and finalizing these proposed articles in addition to lobbying activities at the mini convention in Fresno and by telephone with the three member PCR By-Laws Committee. Had approval been granted in Fresno you would be voting on the submission in the current election.

Although the submission closely parallels at least three other divisions' bylaws we cannot seem to resolve a single issue involving business meeting quorums. This matter probably will not be resolved until the Santa Rosa Convention in April.

For those of you in HO, after a dry spell in new rolling stock we are now seeing a rush of totally new items from

Athearn, Train Miniature, Model Die Casting, AHM, Life-Like and others in the low price range. Be sure to stop by your local hobby shop and ask to see what's new. Tell 'em the Cajon Division sent you.

Lastly, for Christmas many of your relatives, friends and neighbors have purchased their first train sets (Yes, it's hard to believe but many otherwise intelligent and civilized persons may wait years before they purchase one of the most essential elements in modern culture). Many of these train sets will not survive their first year with the would-be railroaders because of mechanical/electrical problems. operational limitations or declining interest due to lack of challenge in their beginning modeling. This is where you can be a valuable ambassador for the hobby as well as a good Samaritan. All you have to do is ask a leading question such as, "How are you doing with your train set?" If are you doing with your train set?" the person doesn't respond with something like, "Great, my fine-scale scratch-built S.P. AC-6 pulled 85 cars up the Tehachapi Loop I completed in the den last night. you'll probably hear the usual firsttrain set horror stories. Chances are you will either be able to solve the problem directly or you'll have a solution in your own railroad library.

If you take time and use tact we'll probably have another convert to our hobby who would otherwise be lost to us forever.

Give it a try.



Swap & Module Meet Feb 24

The Cajon Division's next big event is the Swap and Module Meet. This will be held on Sat., Feb. 24, 1979 at the San Bernardino Orange Show Grounds in the South Stadium Grandstand Concourse, 689 "E" St. Enter thru Gate 1.

The meet will last from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. with a 9 a.m. set-up time for those with modules. Admission is only $50 \, \text{¢}$ and is free with an operational module or

operating portable layout.

Card table size swap tables must be provided by sellers and will be charged a fee of \$1.00 per table unit over admission. No selling will be allowed in the parking lot. Commercial displays and selling tables are welcomed. Only model railroad and related items (including prototype items) may be sold.

If you plan to bring a module, also plan on bringing a power source, extension cords and masking tape to secure the cords, a few basic tools and rolling stock. AC power will be available from outlets around the concourse. Portable layouts

are also welcome.





Barstow Yard Tour Apr 28

FIRST AND LAST NOTICE.
MAKE YOUR RESERVATIONS NOW!

On April 28, 1979 the Cajon Division and the Santa Fe Railway will sponsor a tour of the Barstow Yard complex including the engine servicing facilities. If you've never been to Barstow you've missed a fifty million dollar ultra-modern classification yard with four sub-yards covering about 600 acres. There's over a hundred miles of track, 320 switches and two humps. You won't find anything like it in the Atlas Snap-Track book. In addition to the Santa Fe operations you'll find a fair number of Union Pacific hot shots running by on the adjacent main line tracks.

Details as to whether the tour will include transportation from San Bernardino via charter bus are being negotiated.

The tour will require reservations and will probably cost about four to six dollars (mainly for partial bus transportation per Santa Fe in the yard) per person. There probably will not be another ORDER BOARD issued prior to this tour so consider this first and last call. Further details and a reservation form are available from:
