

Sales totalled \$1204.70 bringing commission of \$120.47 to the division. An additional \$74 was collected for admissions. The sale of soda and coffee covered their cost as well as the cost of publicity.

Despite the lack of action the auction was well run with a minimum of confusion due to the fine work of the division members who organized and carried out this affair.

Photo Day


Vic promises a clinic that will make us pro's at model photography so that all of us can get our pictures into the hobby press. Vics clinic will also be presented twice.

To get to the Photo Day take Interstate 15 or 15E from San Bernardino toward Barstow. Take the Kenwood offramp and go left to U.S.66 and go right to Blue Cut. (Follow the signs!) Those of you coming from the Barstow side take I-15 toward San Bernardino. Get off at the Cleghorn offramp. Go right to U.S.66 and left to Blue Cut.

San Diego via AMTRAK

The L.A. Division has extended an invitation to Cajon Division members to join them on what looks like a fun trip to San Diego via Amtrak. The dates are October 9th and 10th and either a one day or two day outing is available. The price of \$24 per person includes round trip fare to San Diego and a round trip ticket on the new Trolley from San Diego to the Mexican border.

Enough interest will insure a private car so register as soon as possible. A clinic on the "Amtrak San Diego Corridor" will be presented on the way down. Departure from Fullerton station is at 8:35AM and arrival in San Diego is at 10:45AM. Return trips can be aboard the 3:00PM train arriving Fullerton at 5:05PM or the 7:40PM train arriving Fullerton at 9:35PM on October 9. For those spending the night in San Diego train returns on October 10 at 6:10PM arriving Fullerton at 8:10PM.
