# An Enjoyable Afternoon for All at Season's First Meet

Enthusiasm was high as model railroaders and rail fans alike converged on the Whitney Library on a

sunny Saturday afternoon in February.
Available seating
soon became a premium as the meeting
room quickly filled.
Before long, it was
"standing room only"
which prompted Division Director Jan
Wescott to say, "Next
time, we'll have to reserve two rooms!"
Jan was pleased to see
that 14 members of



the Division Board Team were in attendance.

The meet got underway with a slide show presented by retired locomotive engineer and book author, Bob Larson. Bob entertained the attendees with a fascinating show of slides, which literally chronicled his

40-plus years of service on Western
American railroads.
Beginning by hanging around railroad yards as a boy, Bob's career advanced from "apprentice helper" to tower operator, culminating as a seasoned locomotive engineer.

Through an amazing tenure that spanned over forty years, Larson fired, and then later engineered every type of locomotive from the smallest narrow gauge steamer up through the mightiest articulated monsters, finally ending with the latest word in modern diesel power. Capturing it all through the lens of his camera, Bob related stories with almost every slide

that were on par with the best articles one could read in *Classic Trains* magazine. With references in his narration such as "Hog Head and Hostler" Bob kept his audience in stitches with his colorful "Trainman's Lingo" and wit. At the conclusion of his show, Bob happily autographed copies of his book, Western Pacific Trackside, which were available for purchase.

Next on the agenda came the judging of the model contest, which yielded an impressive array of work from our talented local hobbyists. (See RDC in this issue.)

Following the model contest was the "Show and Tell" portion of the meet. This by far, was the most surprising facet of the afternoon as each presenter did an outstanding job, going into great detail about his project. Attendees were treated to what became several very informative "miniclinics."

Those participating in the "Show and Tell" were:

Lynn Austin, who displayed a steel wheel and axle assembly from his current project, which is an 8/10<sup>th</sup> scale model of a 1931 Southern Pacific style baggage wagon. Lynn explained that though quite large, modeling it at 8/10<sup>th</sup> scale will





keep it small enough to roll through most common doorways, and easy enough to transport to shows. Also working with metals was newly joined NMRA member Tim Freese, who displayed an HO scale New York Central 4-8-2 locomotive constructed in brass from a kit. Tim related that



With the aid of a test bed and a Lenz power supply, John was able to demonstrate the various features of a sound equipped locomotive under DCC control.

Next up was Duane Yoder with an On30 scale train. Starting with a standard Oscale 2-6-0 Bachmann locomotive, Duane extensively detailed his model by scratch building a new cab and pilot, repositioning the




Duane Yoder's On30 train.

steam dome and adding or replacing other details. Duane also scratch built the upper portion of the locomotive's tender, as well as a new cupola for the caboose. Along with the accompanying boxcar, the entire train was then weathered with chalks.

For his "Show and Tell", Chuck
Nauman displayed a set of finely crafted lumber loads for N scale flat cars by a company called "Details, Details."

Kurt Meisel gave an interesting talk on a turn-of-thecentury short line called "Angel's Flight". Angel's Flight is a 333-foot railroad consisting of two counterbalanced cars, powered by a single motor. Oper-



ated by one man, Angel's Flight would climb a 30-degree incline in an exclusive Los Angeles residential neighborhood called Bunker Hill. Kurt feels that this prototype would make a nice project for scale modeling.


published in any of these years: 1986. 1988, 1990, 1992, 1994, and 1998.

with. Something serious, something humorous, add to it, subtract from it or whatever you can come up with. Scenery is not required, but could make your entry look better, depending upon the use you make of it.


Judging will be like last year, by popular vote. There will be cash prizes for the winners of first, second and third.

Congratulations and kudos to three members, pictured on the next page, for their efforts in earning their Achievement Certificates in the NMRA Achievement Program.






Brian Block's Merit Award Winning Mine






# DAVID VILLENEUVE, CANDIDATE CAJON DIVISION SUPERINTENDENT
